OEA CONSTITUTION -

- Provides for OEA-Retired as a Division of OEA with one statewide electoral unit
 - o ARTICLE III GOVERNANCE STRUCTURE: Section 1. Divisions; Section 2d. Electoral Units.
- Provides for election and term for OEA-R seat on the OEA Board of Directors, with OEA-R
 Officers as Alternates.
 - o ARTICLE V BOARD OF DIRECTORS: Section 3. Elections and Terms.; 3i and 3j

OEA BYLAWS -

- Establishes Retired membership class, qualifications, and dues set by OEA Board of Directors.
 - o 2. MEMBERSHIP: 2-1. Classes.; 2-1a. and 2-1f.; 2-4c. Membership Dues.
- Defines OEA-Retired Membership as receiving state retirement system benefits and meeting Bylaw 2-1f requirements.
 - o 3. DEFINITIONS: 3-3. OEA Retired
- Provides for the allocation, nomination, and election of one OEA Representative Assembly
 Delegate and one Alternate per 200 qualified Retired members.
 - 4. REPRESENTATIVE ASSEMBLY: 4-3d. Allocation of Delegates. and 4-9i. Election and Certification of Delegates.
- Establishes the function of OEA-Retired. Provides for election of OEA-Retired Chairperson and Officers, a guidance body (Advisory Council), and Guidelines subject to approval by the OEA Board of Directors.
 - o 8. DIVISIONS AND COMMITTEES: 8-1. Divisions.; 8-2 Functions of Divisions.
- Requires that the Advisory Council provide a slate of names recommended to the OEA President for the appointment of one member to each OEA Core Function Committee and each OEA Standing Committee for a term of three years. Provides for the publication of open positions.
