NEOEA Names Next Executive Director

NEOEA has selected East Cleveland teacher **Mary Alice Conkey** as its next Executive Director. Ms. Conkey, who served as NEOEA's 2012-14 president, will take over as executive director of the North Eastern Ohio Education Association on September 1.

A graduate of Notre Dame College with a master's degree from John Carroll University, the 31-year teacher is an intervention specialist at Mayfair Elementary School in the East Cleveland City School District and has been president of the East Cleveland Education Association since 1999. Long known within the education community as a strong union advocate, she chairs the Organizing Strategies Committee of the Ohio Education Association.

Ms. Conkey will be NEOEA's twelfth executive director since 1910, the third to serve full-time, and the first female to hold the position. She will succeed former Warrensville Heights and Aurora teacher **Bill Lavezzi**, who has been executive director since 2000.

Meeting at Tri-C Corporate College East following NEOEA's annual Megaconference, NEOEA's Board of Directors voted to hire Ms. Conkey following a six-month search that began in summer 2015 and included interviews in the fall. Under a transition plan developed by the board's Personnel and Office Operations Committee, she will work part -time during the 2016-17 school year while Mr. Lavezzi continues to maintain office operations.
