NEA-R Delegate and OEA-R Advisory Council Elections

OEA is once again conducting the OEA-Retired elections online using Election-America.com as the service provider. All OEA-R members should be receiving a letter and/or email with instructions for online voting or requesting a paper ballot. Balloting deadline is March 31.

In the Fall OEA-R Election only 7.8% of OEA-R members cast a vote, down from 23-25% in previous years when OEA conducted OEA-R elections by paper ballot mailed to your home along with candidate profiles.

The online voting process may be confusing and requires clicking through several screens and entering an "Election Code" and a "Voting PIN". The candidate profiles are not available until you are actually on the ballot screen and then they must be downloaded to be viewed.

Of the six candidates for **OEA-R Advisory Council At-Large**, one is from NEOEA: **Donna Smoot Walters**.

If you have just received a letter or email "Vote now in the OEA-Retired 2017 Elections" from "Ohio Education Association <help@election-america.com>" here is what to expect:

- In the email or letter you will receive your "Election Code" and a "Voting PIN". There is a link to the OEA webpage describing the election, with another link to the voting site.
- On the voting site, you will be asked to enter your "Election Code" and a "Voting PIN".
- 3. On the next screen you will see a description of the elections.
- 4. The next screen is the actual ballot with links to download the candidate profiles.
- The next screen is a confirmation screen for you to review your voting selections.
- 6. The last screen reports that your vote has been submitted and includes a link to go back and enter a new "Election Code" and a "Voting PIN" if another member is with you, has their code and PIN, and is ready to vote.

Although the OEA-R Delegate Assembly has called for a return to paper ballots, it appears that online voting is with us for the foreseeable future. If you have comments or concerns please contact:
